

RHAC Ladies won the 72 mile Boundary Relay in a record time of 10 hours 7 minutes, beating Denby Dale Ladies' previous best by 1 hour 7 minutes. The 10-stage event, mostly off-road started at 8 am on Saturday 14th June.

Denby Dale had won the ladies' event for the last four years, and their men's team was again victorious in just over eight hours, with Barnsley Harriers taking the veteran men's team prize.

## ...AND TUNE MAKES FOUR

Dave Tune became Rotherham's fourth individual road league winner at Armthorpe after Lee Collingwood, Darren Hale and Rob Holladay had set the pattern, with a sharp 24 minute time, comfortable enough certainly but not that far in front of an impressive performance from Paul Bennett who has undoubtedly got his head round road racing at the moment. Paul had a close race with Lee Collingwood but Lee understandably faded a bit having won the Yorkshire silver medal the day before at South Leeds Stadium.

Not for the first time, the RH 1-2-3 heralded an avalanche of Rotherham runners, with no fewer than sixteen scoring in the first 22 runners home. Darren Hale was disappointed to find Mark Lavender not present, as the closeness of the aggregate times meant there was work to be done, and he thrives on it- but he has been the in-form man over the series and a very worthy winner. Ian Lanceley's race times are getting suddenly shorter, and after he had lifted the award for second place in the series there was Richard Harris in third to remind us that for the second year in succession it is incoming RH talent at the top. According to my lists, other RH placements over the series were John Comrie (5), Steve Inglis (7), Steve Tompkin (8) and Jeff Crofts (9).

Steve Inglis, despite a recent injury, is in a class of his own at junior level at the moment, and there was never any question who was going to win the veteran prize with Peter Morris storming around as he is, he could have taken the senior silver on his times. David Ritchie was fourth vet in the series, behind Peter Morris, Alan Willis (D&S) and John Kerr (Steel C)

In the ladies series, Hallam vet Carol Wolstenholme, running as a senior, was untouchable, but that meant that Hilary Garrison took the ladies award with Gill Bunker third. Jenny Baker was fourth over-45.

No surprise then to find that the three team awards stayed at Rotherham, the winning margins almost embarrassingly large. Again we have to observe that this situation is down to our determination, training and organisation for the most part, also though down to the lack of it apparently in other clubs. Doncaster and Stainforth are progressing, and both clubs originally were very much present in events like these; Barnsley are still there in numbers but missing front support Barnsley are still there in numbers but missing front runners. After that however 'bigger' clubs are not much in evidence and the events are made viable by the superb participation of those with smaller numbers, notably Kimberworth, Maltby, Askern and Totley. ### Tickhill 10

Next Wednesday, 9th July is the Tickhill Ten, Herringthorpe to the Carpenter's at Tickhill. This annual event will be a point-to-point YOT handicap, state your own time and run without a watch. Nearest to time are the winners. I have removed this event from the club championship owing to the fact that it cannot be adequately marshalled as a straight race, running as it would along some very busy roads. We therefore have to say that you must look after your own safety in this event, take the safest options you can find and be well aware of traffic on the roads between Rotherham and Tickhill.

The off is at 6.45 from the mile marker next to the Hospice above Herringthorpe, the end of the run is behind the Carpenter's at Tickhill, next to the main church. Make your own way, a suggested possibility is Stag, Brecks, Wickersley, Maltby centre, Avon estate, over the hill into Tickhill, under the railway bridge, fork left in the lay-by then veer right direct to the church.

There will be cars at the club to put your gear into, get it back at the Carpenters. It is usual for lifts to be available back to Rotherham but best by far is to make your own arrangement if you can. But we have never lost anyone permanently on this occasion as far as we know.

### Yorks vets relays

With Chris Beighton in plaster, hopefully on the mend, and Paul Venables waiting to see, we have been further hit by Dave Hindmarsh's knee injury. Fortunately it sounds as though David is recovering well enough to train shortly, but he may well not be back in time for the Yorkshire vets relays on the 13th July. We have three over 40 (4x), one over 50 (3x) and two ladies (3x) teams entered (named on the day).

Our dominance in this event in recent years looks easy from a distance but far from it, it is top quality that has done it. You never know who is waiting to ambush you. Fortunate therefore that to add to Peter Morris' fine current running we have a whole range of vet runners hitting form at the right time. None better than captain Peter Neal and Ian Temperton, both of whom looked sharp at Damflask. Steve Gaines and Steve Elvidge too are in good form- and they are not alone. We will have to run to best potential to keep the trophy, but we can do it.

The ladies too are in danger, though for a different reason, with Sharon Burton and Gill Bunker lined up to run the Lyke Wake route the day before. We certainly have a formidable line-up if for example Julia Jennings, Hilary Garrison and Caroline Boyd are available; if not we have some improving reserves who might stand in, but it will be more difficult.

• Darren Hale added the Penistone Tough Ten to his list of number ones, winning from Tony Wright (D&S) with Mark Ruddleston third.

• Rob Holladay again won the Oughtibridge Chase three weeks ago, up the naughty hill towards Grenoside, quite a tough one. My informant on this occasion is Adrian Roberts who, it is good to see, was back in competition himself, running in third place.

• Peter Pleasants qualifies 1st August and tells me he has got his enthusiasm back for running. This is good news for Peter and good news for us. He looked well at home at Damflask where he ran as a non-scorer and could well threaten for a team place in the six-stage relays which are upcoming in September and October. He is lining up an attempt at the Windsor-Chiswick marathon (formerly "Polytechnic") on September 28th with the Slough 3 weeks before- good cash prizes involved- and would welcome any colleagues interested in a team venture.

#### • Wharncliffe Gala Chase


## CENTURY'S WORST WEATHER FAILS TO DAMPEN RH ENTHUSIASM

The scent of roses eventually accompanied Rotherham's performance at the Damflask South Yorkshire relays, but it was a close-run thing judging by the complete shambles which led up to the start. None of this down to the organisers, it is all attributable to the way we do it, and to the diabolical weather on the night, most unseasonable for this event. As it turned out we just about got away with it again and 46 runners on the night is a huge achievement by all concerned. It is well worth the bother when we get numbers like this.

The first team was relatively weak I suppose but Paul Bennett and Rob Holladay were always going to be strong and ran the fastest times on the night. We relied on experience for the other places, bringing Mark Ruddleston in to start and transferring Peter Morris from the vets on stage three. Mark held us close enough for Paul to fly into the lead on stage two; Peter is too good a time-trialler to lose this sort of advantage and Robert brought us home impressively. Losing Mr. Morris didn't do too much harm to the vets team, Peter Neal, Ian Temperton, Alan Chell and Steve Gaines winning in fine style in overall fourth place.

The other teams all performed well and it was great to see such a mass of black. Notable were a very promising 19.19 from Richard Chapman and a sharpish 18.54 from Tim Drake.

Though we couldn't match Sheffield's consistency on the night we did very well in the ladies event with Julie O'Mara, Sharron Marshall and Janet Hindley second place, and third overall were Julia Jennings, Gill Bunker and Sharon Burton taking first vets award. Julie was especially quick at 21.12 and it was especially nice to see Janet back after injury, as also in the second team where Joanna Roberts made a steady return joining Caroline Dauris and Claire Goldsborough. Again flying the Rotherham flag after their outing in the national relay, Janet Pike, Pat Wells and Jen Baker ran well to finish 11th overall.
