




Rob Watkinson (honest) in splendid isolation, only pedestrians in attendance near completion of stage 2 at Nottingham.

If you thought participation is going down, think again. Ten years ago in newsletter no.3 I was desperately asking for news to fill a double sheet like this. This year even at short notice there's so much going on you need a microscope to read it- even without general articles. I will ask Bert if the finances support an 8-pager. Is "Rotherham Runner" OK?- I know some members are athletes rather than runners. How it unfolded.

Jim Brogan reports:

A solid looking field of 20 runners reported for the start of the race Frank O'Neill, as always, got the race underway on the stroke of 11:00am, with a15 minute start on scratch runner and course record holder Mark Ruddleston. Frank was still out in front at the end of lap 1, leading last years winner, Jim Gallacher by 38 seconds.

However, Phil Smales had now moved up to 4th place and was looking good at this stage. At the end of lap 2 Phil had swept into the lead. But Kerry Booth, showing no after effects from his recent 3rd place in the 50 mile Round Rotherham Run, was closing ominously in 2nd place, having reduced the deficit behind Phil from 1 minute 30 seconds on lap 1 to only 24 seconds. By the finish Kerry was some 1 minute and 6 seconds ahead of Phil to record his first ever victory in the race.

Moving powerfully through the field, scratch runner Mark Ruddleston closed to within 6 seconds of Phil to take 3rd place and also break the course record with the fastest time of the day with a time of 27 minutes 14 seconds.

### Club Championships and Mileage Award Presentation 2003

Presentations were made at the Rotherham Cricket Club on December 17 Awards were presented by Peter Neal the Road Running Chairman.
