If this is the future of RHAC, we have nothing to fear. The under-15 boys squad turned in a brilliant team performance at Beckett Park in the gloom and cold. Fancied maybe to take silver, they turned the form-book on its head, narrowly beating favourites Holmfirth at their own game. Richard Lomas led them in as usual, running a fine third behind Doncaster's Steve Bates with King (Holmfirth) second. Jamie Russell had a strong run in 9th spot and Kirsten Cawthorne was a very solid fourth Whitaker's superb 7th place, which just unfortunately missed out on Yorks team selection, barring injuries. Icing on the cake, Rotherham finished a second team in 9th place through T.Smith, Andy Hudson, Cain Green and Ashley Blackner.

Lyndsey Carnell represented us well at under-13, finishing 5th with backup from Roisin Kelly, as did Liam Rooney and Richard Dennis in the boys event. At under-15 girls Kelly Walker and Charlotte Birch were our representatives. Sadly, none of these finsihed a team, partly down to illnesses, though the under-15s were unlucky as Simone Goldsborough was spiked shortly after the start. Steve Inglis was solo for RH at under-17, looked strong early on, maybe overcooked it a bit, but held on well to finish 5th.


Silver Lining for Ladies The ladies missed the gold, but found a silver lining, both at under-17

Having said that, the Rotherham contingent performed brilliantly, and after a variety of vests it was black, black, black as Julie O'Mara narrowly led home lulia Jennings and Janet Hindley. With Rob Holladay still indisposed and Chris Parkes defying the laws of physics at the Round Rotherham 50, we also have to rule out the likes of Darren Cooney, Martin Connolly and Richard Harris from team competition whilst they qualify. Enough of that, the runners who did represent us could not have done it better. Some measure of the team's commitment can be gained from the facts that Steve Gaines arrived in time for a warm-up lap, Mark Ruddleston had time to pin his number on, and even Steve Elvidge was there shortly before the gun. 


