


# TUNE AND PARKES BACK ON SONG

The brief absence of Dave Tune with a worrying back problem and the longer silence from Chris Parkes came to an abrupt end this week with a couple of impressive performances.

It has been a very worrying month for David as the many runners with back problems will readily understand. After a lot of physio treatment and patience the problem is gone and his training is going beter and better. A try-out at Beverley 10k showed no real problems and on Sunday 29th he turned in a 31 minute time, good enough to gain first place in the Immingham 10k, and in the process beating visitor Bruce Chinnick (Westbury), a sub-30 10k runner who won the Bristoi Half marathon this year. Dave will probably try the Armthorpe road league as a sharpener and intends if current coughs and colds allow to run the Northern Championship 5k and a little later the Scottish Open 10k Championship, where he will be accompanied by Lee Collingwood.

Chris' return to race form has been most carefully and accurately judged. Interest in his progress is partly that of seeing such a fine athlete back in contention, also that we have been informed that he will team-score as from Feb 1st. It is great to have him running in Rotherham colours again. He has rejoined the race circuit cautiously, accepting lower places in several local races, but on Sunday in the former Ernest Harper 10 (now the "Pinegrove") the waiting was over as he stormed away to an impressive victory, in the process beating Martin Connolly of SAC. Martin has been running very well, which gives a better measure of Chris' performance than his 50 minute 50 time as the course, rerouted by road works in Hillsborough, was reckoned to be maybe nearer 9.5 miles than 10.

Pete Neal came home ninth in the same race in around 54 minutes, followed by Parkes' training partner John Comrie. John's hundred-mile training weeks may have caught up with him a little on the day but he will be out to prove otherwise in tonight;'s club Tickhill 10.

#### RH VETS NATIONAL FIFTEENTH

A sharp 15.10 for the three-mile leg from Chris Beighton placed him fifteenth equal fastest on the day and with very solid backing from team colleagues brought Rotherham home in fifteenth place in the national 8-stage relays (Sutton Park May 20th).

The challenge against Kimberworth and Maltby was an interesting experience and we thank the clubs most sincerely for their sporting acceptance. It is very difficult to estimate the comparative strengths of clubs and I got it slightly wrong, to the extent that RHAC selections were too strong in depth. I suppose it is something to be happy about looked at in a different light. Anyway, after ruling out 28 RHAC runners our selection at Kimberworth 6 won easily last month. Subsequently I added first three Pete Humphries, Jerry Spencer and John Atkinson to the banned list so that at the Prince we were represented by Rob McCarthy (34.41), Garry Hammonds (34.53), Terry Hawley (35.33), Dave Richards (36.07), Steve Elvidge (36.43) and Hugh O'Mara (36.59). They were also too strong, their 214.56 total beating Maltby (223.43) and Kimberworth (224.46) by a decent margin.

McCarthy, Hammonds and Hawley were added to the list (now making 35) so that at Wombwell in the last fixture we were represented by Steve Elvidge (28.19), Phil Smales (28.51), Dave Richards (29.17), Steve Newsum (29.24), Darryl Bennett (29.46) and John Beckett (31.12). Their total of 176.49 was just behind Kimberworth's 175.28 (France, Rowe, Gaynor, Turner, Green, Senior) but in front of Maltby's 178.49 (Durham, P.Rust, J.Rust, Lowndes, Houghton, Sturart). The total over three races saw RHAC win comfortably enough, but the events certainly provided a focus for a number fo runners and the effort was thoroughly justified. Thanks to all concerned.



#### 1 Ferriby 10 2 Norton 9 3 Spen 20 Sheffield Marathon and Half

I have the results list but there are no clubs. This makes the job impossible. Therefore I have to ask members:-

If you ran at Sheffield let me know: there will be lists in the changing rooms, or simply tell me so I can place you.

#### South Yorks Road League

With one fixture remaining, that is the fast flat Armthorpe course, current standings and chances appear as follows (fewer individual awards this year with less sponsorship):

In the seniors, Lee Collingwood lies third (76.47) behind Martin Connolly (76.00) and Mark Lavender (76.10). Peter Neal (80.02) and John Comrie (80.38) are currently out of the awards in 5th and 6th place.

Alan Gregory(81.51) edged out John Kerr (SCS) (81.14) by 1 second at Wombwell but may not be able to turn this deficit round in the vets. In the O-50s Pete Humphries' desperate run at Worsborough puts him fourth and out of it, and we have no O-60 scorer.

Jane Clarke (100.39) has run particularly well but will not catch Ruby Bentley (BAC) (97.54) so will have to settle for a commendable second place. Julia Fretwell leads the U-17 but I am not sure that there is any award for it. Nonetheless it is encouraging to have Julia and Emma Green running with us at this level.

Hilary Garrison (96.21) needs to make up 44 seconds on Linda Westlake (BAC) (95.37) which is perhaps too tall an order, but Rose Grimley (99.39) has no challenger near enough in the over-45 category.

Teamwise, the picture is a bit stronger. The senior men (4 count) are out of contention for first where Barnsley, who lead by 3 minutes, only have to turn up but will be easily second. In the vets (3 count), we lie 25 seconds behind Steel City and 11 seconds in front of Stainforth. The sharper end of our veteran runners are aware of the situation and Armthorpe should prove interesting in this category. The ladies team (3 count) is a total combined team and Rotherham (296.21) convincingly lead Barnsley AC (301.40) with no-one else in sight.
