Rotherham men vets climbed to eighth place in Great Britain last month in the annual eight-stage relays at Sutton Park and looked very much at home. It is difficult to find any star performers, though Pete Morris' last stage 16.51 has to take pride of place, there were simply no weaknesses on the day. With Chris Beighton and Paul Venables both taken off the top of our planned attack, this result has to be seen as a stunning performance (results on back page).

## Cooney Celebrates end of Long Wait




## RH Poised for Clean Sweep

Rotherham stand poised to clean sweep the South Yorkshire team competition in the last event at Armthorpe for the second consecutive year. Not since Barnsley took the senior team in 1995 have we been

With four to score on time aggregate, the RH mid-week hit squad which has included John Comrie, Richard Harris, Steve Inglis, Steve Tompkin and Jeff Crofts has put down a rock-solid base for this success, but it is undoubtedly the dazzling return to form of Ian Lanceley which has broken the back of any opposition. With Darren Hale non-scoring, we have seen first Lee Collingwood at Dinnington, then Robert Holladay at Wombwell augmenting the team- perhaps some local well-known personalities may turn out at Armthorpe on the 11th June? on the 11th June?

With only three to score for the vets, Peter Morris is having another massive season, how he gets so quick so fast after the winter is a mystery. 

#### McDonalds YAL & AAA Road Relay Championships at Sutton Park


The final meeting of the 1996/7winter took us to Birmingham for the Boys relays

During the XC year credit must not only go to the athletes who have won honours and prizes but also to the others who have supported them, take into account the U17 boys where athletes like R.McNabb, J.Oxley, D.Woodhouse who are 400m runners and O.Thomas who is a Hammer/Discus Thower turn out so that distance runners (S.Inglis, J.Silk) can compete, without this type of committment then the U17 boys would not have been able to enter any team events.

The U13 girls, U15 boys and U17 girls have all had an excellent year but without the support of the B and C teams who don't win honours but push the A team our results wouldn't be nearly as good. Of course, having such large squads makes the competition for places difficult.

Sprinters such as U17 girls R.Hart and J.Greaves, U15 girl F.Noon performed really well in distances far greater than they are used to running.
