As far as can be seen, the resulkt is to stand, though I don't know why. Vets running is comparatively laid back, but perhaps this is too far laid back.

Redhill had the gall of running fourth for the second year in succession and otherwise it was only Tipton who got away from us. Selection was not straightforward this year it has to be said. Two or three over-40s were very obvious but the last two or three were very difficult. We did our honest best, maybe it was right, maybe not. Most disappointed would likely be Keith Williams, who has been running well, as after a long process Peter Morris just got the nod. It was understandable but unfortunate that Keith wasn't very interested in joining us as a ten-man squad, as Martin Connolly subsequently reported ill on his return from holiday on the Thursday, leaving Gary Durham as first reserve to fill the spot. Gary, who must have been a bit dismayed not to be initially in the team, ran well on stage four. Gary's place as first reserve was taken up by Steve Gaines, himself running as well as ever and generously keeping shtumm about his team selection.

It is a fine testimony to your standards when you feel a bit tight-lipped about coming sixth in the United Kingdom- in some cases to ringers into the bargain! The whole squad ran within a shade of each other, all fine efforts but the highlights a sharp 15.35 from Paul Venables which you might say, on his recent brilliant form, was more or less expected, he doesn't get many wrong. Despite this being his second visit ever, and of course the second within a month, Paul will be beginnning to like this venue. As must Phil Roberts, he ran an excellent 15.45 opener to get us off soundly.

Paula Fisher stepped up to take the place of Sharon Burton, reporting ill, and was togwether with Hilary Garrison and Gill Bunker ran the Rotherham ladies into the same equivalent spot, sixth place. Hilary was amongst the sharpish times into the bargain.

At men over 50, Malcolm Palfreyman ran a stormer on the last stage to pull us up to 7th after some earlier good work, notably from debutee Mick Marsters, who having been persuaded gradually over a week or two to turn out found that the discipline was well to his liking, and ran a nice 17.10 on stage three. So, the more senior outfit, having never managed to get together at this event before, ran an impressive seventh. Though very unofficial, it is interesting to compare how many clubs had as many teams inside tenth place- though of course we did miss out on the more senior results at over 60,70 and ladies .


