The men's team and women's team both did well as maybe also the vets.


The numbers present were so good in fact I ran out of numbers.




The Worksop Connection Paul Bennett (L) and Mick Thompson


(below) , top RHAC supporters in the 1994 relays.

Rotherham's first appearance in the National 12-Stage Road Relays was marked less for its result in the placings than for its contribution to the reconstruction of competitive road running which has been taking place this season.

In fact, we never targeted this race (which is ridiculous with hindsight) and were always condemned to be under strength on the day. This is a mistake we will never again make. In future, National events should be the target, with qualifying a part of the process. In the event, a very respectable team ran 42nd out of 57, so keeping out of the basement. This was the best we could hope for, and the effort and commitment of the runners was a most gratifying aspect.

It seems to me that no club turns out its strongest possible team, but the sort of top-strength side that we can field should be capable of making the top 25 in future
