SUTTON PARK: GOOD NEWS AND BAD

When young we soon learn that there will be good days and bad days. What is totally perplexing is that there are days like this, where despair and elation are impossible to untangle. The passage of a few weeks since the event has not helped, it simply depends how you look at it.

From viewpoint one, put simply, the record books will show us unplaced, as we did not finish stage three. From viewpoint two however, as the recorded and published times show, this was undoubtedly the finest performance of any RH team, even in that sense eclipsing the tenth place six-stage performance of last October and plainly indicating the trend in status that we are displaying. We got the equivalent of seventh position with more than two minutes penalty!

The facts speak for themselves. Rob Holladay ran the first long stage, a wellknown danger spot that he has become masterful at, followed by Darren Hale who needed to keep shorter after altitude training for London. After a great start from Rob and Darren, Dave Tune flew us into fifth place before a hamstring injury stopped him in his tracks. Dave couldn't finish the stage, which must have done a lot for Mark Ruddleston's blood pressure as he was poised for lift-off on stage four. Peter Neal sorted out the officials, and to his very great credit, the race referee Mr. Riley let Mark go in nineteenth place which was a loss of some two and a half minutes on where we would have been placed.

Mark got his head round the problem wonderfully, his long explanations to all the spectators round the lap must have settled him, and Darren Cooney on long stage five put us right back amongst it with a sharp effort. Paul Rowland's short stage six was more like the Paul of old, he looked really good and obviously enjoyed it as we moved back through the field.


It would be all to easy in these circumstances to let the event go and I can only have admiration for the way the whole team got behind this effort as the second half six maintained a fine momentum which saw us move, albeit unofficially, to seventh place on the day. A fine Paul Bennett effort on long handed over to a revitalised Martin Connolly, and after Lee Collingwood and Steve Tompkin had maintained the march up the list it was Luke Field, back from injury and sharp again, and the reliable Pete Morris who rounded off a fine salvage job on what could have been a total disaster.

This was a really staggering effort and outcome, and both the performance and the demeanour of all the athletes left us all proud of them. But the result is not official at the end of the day, and it is hard to keep aggravation at bay! But we know what we can do, and we will be back.

Good work from the ladies too, with a senior 1-2 from Julie O'Mara (29.54) and Janet Hindley (30.45) and with Gill Bunker (32.36) leading the vet 35 class.

Dave sadly is long-term injured and only running a little whilst Chris is progressing but not yet match-fit.

Against that however we can reckon on sharp work from seen at last years new qualifiers Phil Roberts and Martin Connolly with Rother Valley Martin especially threatening to hit the big targets he was

Very worrying however is Paul Venables situation, having been hit by apparently a virus problem at the Dinnington Road League he reported OK again after Spencers' Arms dash but had to pull out of a training run with the same problem and is seriously doubtful. His refound speed would definitely be missed, but John Atkinson stands by and off the back of a good London performance he is just the replacement you would wish for.

Likely line-up is Phil Roberts, Alan Chell, Peter Neal, Ian Temperton, Martin Connolly, Steve Gaines, Peter Morris and Paul Venables with John Atkinson in for stage 8 if Paul doesn't pull round.

Gateshead's David Miles flew away with the Rother Valley event from Adrian Clark (Chesterfield), our leading runner being Martin Connolly in 4th (33.34), and first vet. Not far adrift Phil Roberts (7th) not quite happy in the heat, and Malcolm Palfreyman first over-50 not far after. The three of them took the team award.

This, though flat, is not a fast course and Martin reckons he is worth a 32 minutes

score at the moment. We have to agree, following his brilliant 54 minute effort at the Tadcaster 10 which brought him home in second place. In fact he lead the race for nine miles. Malcolm, too, is not running many bad ones at the moment.

Milton 6

Luke Field's time out injured appears to have done him no harm. After a smart road league result and a very tidy 12-stage relay performance he romped away with the Milton 6 title on Sunday, his 30.44 taking a slice off Peter Pleasants' course record into the bargain. 

vet contingent looked good, amongst them John Atkinson, Jerry Spencer and Tony Turner. And of course Doug Rufus.






SHEFFIELD EVENT LOSES ITS WAY

Bizarre goings on at Sheffield in both Half and Full marathon which could see a revised view of permission for future events- which would be a pity especially in view of the dwindling number of such now taking place. Put simply, the course was undermanned. Not generally, but in one specific place, but that one the worst of all possible places, just a few hundred yards from the finish. A good batch of half and full marathon runners failed in the absence of any marshal to take the turn off Worksop Road , which led round the back of the stadium, opting instead for the direct route into Don Valley.

Thus Darren Teasdale and Simon Dale, lying 4th and 5th, ran on to the track 2nd and 3rd and were more or less promptly disqualified on the grounds that runners are themselves responsible for keeping to the route. A number of (cynical) colleagues have pointed out that for Darren to lose the route is not that unusual, but it won't do. More confusing, marathon runners who followed suite were not disqualified, if the reasoning was sound they should have been. Presumably the referee judged that

matters could be put fight later in the marathon, whereas in the half it was too late. So they ran several laps of the track to make it up later- unusual to say the least.

The marshalling error at that point also led to shambles as out-going marathon runners half a mile into their second lap swung left round the corner



I am not trying to knock the Sheffield organisers here; whilst undeniably a cock-up it is the sort of bad luck that could happen to anyone. And anybody willing to take on a big event like this deserves understanding rather than knocking. But I am puzzled by the reasoning behind the choice of route. It ducks and weaves continuously, and seems to take as many marshals as runners. There were dozens of them out on Sunday, but on such a course there is no safety factor at all. As Dave Haywood says, keep the finish straight.

RH perspecive

Not a huge turn-out, our half-marathon runners led by Rob Holladay just shaded by Ian Fisher, Carl Thackery having stolen the thunder at his best distance. At marathon Male Palfreyman (right) took the O-50 which is quite a habit these days; there was a promising debut for Steve Tompkin with Peter Adams alsio in good marathon form.
