National 12 Stge Relays

Super RH follow Cooney's

lead


Spearheaded by a great Darren Cooney launch which saw him in the top 25 times on the day, RHAC relay team held briliantly on course to finish a very tidy 18th at Sutton Park in the National Twelve Stage final on April 24th.

It's easy to forget the years we spent in the wilderness before qualifying for this event, and once we did in 1994 our results have gone 42nd, 47th, 39th, 23rd, and then last year "did not finish" although we had the galling experience of running stunningly fast to an equivalent top ten. This year's eighteenth is therefore the best ever for RHAC, in what is the premier event for road running in the country. And in this context the country is Great Britain, not England.

Once Darren had given us that start, and mindful of the runners to follow there was never any doubt that a good result was likely. There are now too many seasoned 'professionals' who know what relay running is about. Maybe we are seeing here the old adage that 'success breeds success'.

Having said that, we had three debutants at the event, Ian Whitaker at 16 with a great future in front of him but already showing serious road speed, Darren Ward who is relishing the opportunities now open to him after his earlier career at Doncaster, and remarkably for his pedigree, Paul Venables, who down to injury and other circumstances never got to Sutton Park either with RHAC or Sheffield during his spell there.

Richard Harris took the second long stage and delighted himself and us with a sub-28 time for the first time; he really is flying along now, and on 2 and 4 we had Lee Collingwood back towards proper form and a rejuvenated Mark Ruddleston with only a few seonds separating them. Not at all a bad quartet to start off in this company; the start of the national really is fierce.

Andy Aked turned in a useful 28.02 on stage 5, whilst this is well off his sort of time he was coming off an injury lay-off and it is a mark of what a good clubman he is that as soon as he is anything like capable of a decent time he is willing to turn out. The following short stage went a bit wrong for Ian Whitaker, but he did all the right things, notably not going silly on the hilly start, and looked set for a good stage when he tied up at the turn, possibly with stitch, and was needless to say in such company, passed by a good few. But he got back, and the time was no slower than many others on the day. He will have learned from the experience and no doubt has many good relay stages to come.

With Paul Venables and Phil Roberts taking the next long/short pair there was no need for alarm, they pulled back four with two very good stages and Darren Ward did likewise on the next long leg. John Comrie ran for his club too, having only just completed the Rotterdam Marathon he did well enough and we looked sound for a top twenty spot. The main point of interest now was whether Sheffield AC with their new student imports could get ahead of us at the end, the relative positionshad turned and turned about through all the later stages. Having missed the Northern through other commitments, RH vets played a major role at Sutton Park, and it was perhaps fitting that Steve Elvidge (long 11) and Martin Connolly on 12 should round off the day. Steve ran a good stage, though not at his fastest perhaps after a bit of bug trouble, and Martin being ex-SAC himslef ddid not take much convincing that he needed to shift a bit. Which he did, his 16.02 a fine return towards form.

All in all, with the obvious missing runners, we have to see this as a major performance which underlines just how far we have come in these events, and in general. I team managed on the day, and Peter Morris and team captain Peter Neal travelled as reserves. Once again, I wonder whether any Rotherham team enjoys such a high standing in Britain, even including the impressive RUFC. And yet we could well go higher!

Due to a large batch of exam assessments, this issue is late, and done too fast and consequently will not cover all that it ought to cover. Your understanding is appreciated.

Harris-Aked 1-2 Launches '99 Campaign

Sometimes when you feel depressed, you wake up one morning and the sun is shining and you wonder what all the fuss was about, life is so easy. Only two months ago after a poor cross-country local turn-out, and facing a struggle for a northern 12-stage team (albeit for good reasons) I felt just like that. The 12-stage northern and national could not have gone better in the cirumstances, but what came as the ray of sunshine was the turn-out at the first South Yorks road league at Dinnington.

Arguably, if you can't turn out on your own patch then you are in trouble, but this was by any measure a fine effort, with a clear lead established in both men and veteran men's events, and ladies. Rotherham provided just over one in five of all the runners, and there was a slight increaseon last year's appearance figure with the men +half a dozen and the ladies about a dozen.

Richard Harris of course was South Yorkshire champion three years back but he has never run this fast, and had a stormer of a race to take first place for the first time. But not the last I feel sure judging by how well he is going. No small sharpener on the day would have come from Andy Aked, who if he can now stay injury-free may get back to his rightful form- which is seriously fast, and he is moderatley pleased with his 25.45 second place in the meantime. It is especially pleasing to see both these top club supporters doing well; both have had more than their share of injury but both have been always willing to support us if humanly possible, not always to their satisfaction or best interests timewise, but always to our advantage.

Mark Ruddleston, another who could be fitted to that category, only just missed third having eased out D&S' Simon Wright. Lee Collingwood and John Comrie were not far behind. In the vets, Paul Venables won handsomely from Steve Winslow (BAC) with backup from Phil Roberts and Alan Chell, a whole flock of black vests shortly following. Jerry Spencer is in serious contention at O-50, only three secinds behind Pete Wakefield. A fine run from Iain Whitaker as first junior in 27.28 and second junior (29.15) was Paul Marshall, who shows great promise as a road runner also

The ladies too swept the board with Janet Hindley, Caroline Dauris and Vicky Haigh 1-2-4 but first on the night vet Hilary Garrison with a fine 29.55, RH getting 1-2-3 here with Sharon Burton and Paula Fisher. Gill Bunker was first O40 and Rose Grinmley, after a long recovery from injury put in a 35.19 which gained her second place over 45.
